CYPRESS CREEK WATERSHED PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Cypress Creek Water shed comprises an area of about 38 square miles in Hays County, with the creek itself winding its way for about 15 miles through the City of Woodcreek, the City of Wimberley, eventually joining the Blanco River; and

WHEREAS, the high water quality and scenic beauty of Cypress Creek is a major driver for economic development in the region; and

WHEREAS, the Cypress Creek Watershed and underlying aquifer are under increasing demands to meet the needs of a rapidly growing community; and

WHEREAS, the Cypress Creek Watershed and underlying aquifer are susceptible to non-point source pollutants; and

WHEREAS, the River Systems Institute of Texas State University-San Marcos, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and numerous community partners created the Cypress Creek Project to keep the creek clean and clear for the use and enjoyment of future generation.




WHEREAS, the Cypress Creek Project needs community support to be a success and will initiate the first phase of community participation and awareness during the summer of 2008.


NOW THEREFORE, Hays County Commissioners Court does hereby proclaim the week of July 27th through August 2nd as






